# Academic Magnet High School Application Process 



The application to Academic Magnet can be completed electronically once the school choice application portal is opened or on paper and dropped off at a receiving site (local schools) at a set time. Your application contains four parts and is evaluated on a 15 point rubric. You generally want to get at least 13 out of 15 points on the rubric, although the system admits the highest scoring applicants first, so try your best. All information is based on last year's process and may change.
